How **to** identify a term:

Ex. Hammurabi: Lived ca. 1728 – 1686 B.C.E. The sixth king of Babylon, Hammurabi became the first king of the Babylonian Empire, extending Babylon's control over Mesopotamia by winning a series of wars against neighboring kingdoms. Although his empire controlled all of Mesopotamia at the time of his death, his successors were unable to maintain his empire. Hammurabi is known for the set of laws called Hammurabi's Code, one of the first written codes of law in recorded history.
