Placement Exams for the Major:

Please note that all tests below are timed tests that can only be attempted once. Please take a moment to prepare. Please make sure your calculator has fresh batteries or is fully charged. During the test, please turn off all distractions.

1. [Math Placement Test](#) - Only if your SAT MAT was less than 550 or your ACT MAT was less than 22. Take this online placement test as soon as possible and prior to registering for classes. If you don't pass the Math Placement Test with a score of 10 or higher, then register for MAT 1001.
2. [Calculus Readiness Test](#) - You must take Calculus (MAT 1110) for this major and therefore need to take this test regardless of your SAT or ACT score. **If you do not pass the Calc Readiness**, sign up for MAT 1025.
3. [Language Placement](#) - You must take a foreign language sequence of classes for this major and therefore need to take a language placement test.

First-Year Student Course Recommendations:

1. Enroll in **RC 1000 or UCO 1200** (you will take one in your first semester and one in your second semester)
2. **Enroll in MAT 1025 and PHY 1123 with PHY 1113** (see Math Placement note above)
OR
3. Enroll in ***MAT 1110 and PHY 1170 section 410 with PHY 1160** (see Math Placement note above)
4. Enroll in a General Education **Wellness Literacy** course

In your first semester of the major it is recommended that you not take more than 14 hours of course work because of the difficulty of physics and math courses in the same semester.
