

### **Greetings from the AMSA Reproductive Health Project!**

This week we mark the anniversary of the ratification of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, it states:

The right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of sex.

This long-fought for right began more than a century earlier. In 1848, at the first women's rights convention in Seneca Falls, New York, 68 women and 32 men signed a <u>Declaration of Sentiments</u> calling for equal treatment of women and men under the law and voting rights for women.

In the early 1900s, after several horrific industrial fires, such as the <u>Triangle Shirtwaist Factory Fire</u> where 146 young immigrant garment workers lost their lives (many jumping to their deaths when fire truck ladders reached only to the 6th floor, 30 feet below where they stood on window ledges waiting for rescue) a new rallying call to secure the vote for women rang out:

#### "A Vote is a Fire Escape."

Over the next many years suffragettes organized in and with communities to increase the understanding, especially among immigrant communities, that voting <u>IS</u> a way to protect public health and safety. **On August 18, 1920, the 19th Amendment was ratified when it was passed in the Tennessee state house by just one vote.** Where would we be if that voter stayed home that day?

Today we face many complicated issues that impact public health and physician practice. Some voices revel in spewing fear in efforts to protect and expand their profiteering. They seek to divide rather than unite us in finding workable solutions to today's problems, they tell us to sit down, shut up and look to the past for answers. **Those voices benefit when cynicism and doubt prevail.** 

Instead, we call forth a vision for our shared future that nurtures healing and connections across communities. A future that puts people (patients and providers) above profits, protects reproductive freedom, and ensures high-quality, affordable, sustainable health care is available for all. **Together we can reset priorities and make that vision reality.**
