All students are required to earn a minimum of 22 credits to graduate but 28 is recommended. Each high school course is worth 1 credit. Elective classes and/or dual enrollment courses also count as a credit. Two levels of the same language (ex. Spanish I, Spanish II) are advised for students who plan to attend a 4-year college/ university, but are not required for graduation.

Additional Important Information

Come to school. Do your best. Do what's right. Treat others the way you want to be treated.

- Attendance You cannot miss more than 10 days in each class, excused or unexcused
- After high school options Three Es :

Enroll in 2/4 year school, **Enlist** in the military, **Employment** with livable wage.

- **Academics** It's hard to fix a bad 9th grade year.
 - Each class you take earns you a credit. You need 22 credits to graduate. For college or the military, you need those grades to be good. If you fail a class, it puts you behind in requirements and jeopardizes future plans.
 - You earn GPA points for each class you take. Taking more challenging classes can help boost your academic standing. Honors, AP, IB, and CFCC classes offer additional weighting when calculating GPA
 - **Athletics and grades** You must pass 3 of 4 classes each semester and maintain a 2.0 GPA to remain eligible for athletics.
 - **Driver's License and grades** You must pass 3 out 4 classes each semester to be eligible for Driver's Ed AND **keep your license once you earn it!**

Dual Enrollment

- As a junior, you might be eligible to take classes through CFCC and/or UNCW. There
 will be several information sessions to learn more about the programs in February.
 Check your email and listen to the announcements for more information.
- Clubs see Hoggard website. You can also get involved with programs outside of school.
- Tests to expect to take in 11th grade
 - **ACT All 11**th **grade students** are required to take and will be automatically signed up for this test in Spring of junior year. The test is free.
 - PSAT This is optional. This is a pre-SAT test. Students in grades 9-11 can sign up to take
 this test. Be on the lookout for info about signing up. It is only offered once per school year and
 there are no extensions if you miss the sign up deadlines. You do have to pay a fee to take the
 PSAT.
