Article 7: State Justices

- 1. State Justices can bring lawsuits and file amicus briefs in other states and at the Supreme Court level. This shall otherwise not impact their ethical norms
- 2. State Justices shall have one (1) week from a petition posted on a state court's subreddit to grant or deny a writ of certiorari.
- 3. State Justices shall have two (2) weeks from closing arguments to write and publish opinions regarding the case.
- 4. An extension of arguments or opinions may be granted by the State Justices. State Justices may petition the Head State Clerk if they need an extension in their own deliberations.
- 5. Strikes shall be given if a judge has not completed obligations to the court. Three strikes given to a single judge sees them removed from the court
 - a. Judges who are active but are unable to submit the appropriate information on time due to negligence from an inactive judge SHALL NOT get a strike. Strikes can be removed if a justices shows a pattern of being active over three (3) months
 - b. Judges may appeal strikes given to the Head State Clerk
