Mountain Valley Pipeline Loses another Key Permit Weeks after Sierra Club Files Lawsuit

On August 28, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC), the federal agency in charge of approving interstate pipelines, asked the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) to reinitiate consultation to re-evaluate its Incidental Biological Opinion and Take Statement under Endangered Species Act for the fracked gas Mountain Valley Pipeline (MVP), thereby invalidating its current major permit. Because MVP now has lost another key authorization, all work should stop immediately. This announcement came one week after a coalition of conservation groups led by Sierra Club <u>requested a stay</u> while a federal court reviews <u>their legal challenge</u> to the Service's approval for the 303-mile pipeline.

The invalidation of the MVP's key permit comes just over one month after the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit, the same court where Sierra Club is challenging the MVP permit, vacated the same permit issued by the Service for the Atlantic Coast Pipeline (ACP), saying the Service "lost its mandate" when it rushed its approval process to help meet ACP construction deadlines. Continued legal setbacks, ballooning costs of both pipelines, and growing opposition by the public has led some to doubt whether the pipelines, particularly the ACP, will ever be built.
