### Goal:

# Scope:

- Apache way/project/community/Conference/blog relevant updates, news, a summary of the discussion
- interviews with people who do for their apache community, project, foundation, or company
- Use cases, build community, incubator project, communication with other apace members etc.

### Style:

A panel of ALC Beijing members interviews apache persons as the main content of an episode. Additionally, alc beijing members talk about ongoing conversations in the apache project.

#### Format:

For each episode, one person will be responsible for the preparation, research, coordination, and moderation.

A panel of 2-3 (maybe dedicate one person each episode to be a moderator) ALC Beijing members interviews a guest who has done or told a story in their specific context. The interview is about the specific use case of the guest. Each recording is scheduled for 1h and a released episode could be 40 minutes.

- Intro of panel
- Intro of guest
- Interview with guest
- News from the apache foundation/community/project
- Tips and Tricks (?)
- Announcements and upcoming events (? -- depends on our release delay)
- Picks/shout outs

## **Sample Interview Questions:**

- Tell us about yourself and your background.
- Tell us about the open source community and project.
- What is your project goal?
- How did you understand "Community over code"?
- How to run an open source community?
- Great story who want to share?

### Release cadence:

1 episode per month to start with. If interest is good, we can release more often.

## Sustainable Podcast:

- This podcast is produced by the ALC Beijing and does not depend on a single person.
   The panelists will rotate to ensure that there are multiple people in the community who can record an episode.
- A panelist may only be on 3 episodes in a row and then must take a break for at least one episode. This will ensure that we have several ALC Beijing members who can continue the podcast.
- The podcast is intended to run for an undetermined time frame but we will stop if the focus of the ALC Beijing changes or no one wants to continue the podcast.

## Preparation of each episode:

- Discuss with guest what topic they want to discuss and outline what questions and topics to cover in the interview
- Prepare the ALC Beijing updates, news -- could be a summary of ALC Beijing monthly newsletters since last release
