Different stakeholders were invited during the first day of the Three-Day Seminar-Workshop on Planning and Management of Extension Programs conducted last November 16 to 18, 2020 to provide relevant information that will be essential in the planning of extension programs of the different colleges/units of the institution. Resource speakers from CHED, City Planning and Development Office, City Social Welfare and Development Office, Bureau of Corrections- San Ramon Prison and Penal Farm, Barangay Manicahan, and ZABIDA had a 45-minute presentation each and a 15-minute open forum. The three-day seminar-workshop was attended by the extension coordinators and extensionists of the different colleges/units.





Dr. Rody P. Garcia, OIC Director of CHEDRO IX, and Engr. Joseph Lou Sta. Teresa presented the CHED Extension Program mandates and requirements and other relevant information that would serve as bases for the creation of extension programs of the different colleges or departments of ZCSPC.



Jessie Christopher B. Lapinid, Project Evaluation Officer IV of the City Planning and Development Office, presented the updated information of the 98 barangays in Zamboanga City in terms of the sanitation poverty, health and nutrition, employment poverty, barangays with the highest proportion of households below food threshold, barangays with highest proportion of poor households, and other relevant information that would serve as bases for the creation of extension programs of the different colleges or departments of ZCSPC which aim to address the needs of the community.



Darick S. Fabian, Division Chief of the City Social Welfare and Development Office (CSWDO) presented the different programs of CSWD to the various sectors of the community. The information is vital in the possible partnership with the different colleges or departments of ZCSPC.



At the end of the Extension Program MUJER, the beneficiaries should be able to:


- 1. apply knowledge and financial literacy on their livelihood; and

This is the mantra of the Project MUJER (Mobilizing and Upskilling JUANAS for Economic Resiliency) a product of collaboration of the different offices in the University, namely GAD Office, ZCSPC Extension Management Office, Planning and Development Office, and School of Business Administration.

Its aim is to mobilize economically displaced women in the barangay by conducting a livelihood training program, transfer knowledge and competencies for healthy food production.

The six (6) day Training Program will run from July 17,18,24,25,31 to August 1, 2021. Twenty (20) participants from Barangay Baliwasan will serve as pilot trainees and are expected to apply the knowledge and financial literacy on their livelihood as well as develop entrepreneurial skills on basic sales and marketing at the end of the training.
