The service is continuing as usual, carrying outreach from 6:00am 365 days of the year. It is open to clients for support from 8:00am-5:00pm Monday to Friday and 8:00am-2:00pm Saturday and Sundays.

Referrals can be made by other services, shops, members of the public, by the client themselves or anyone by calling 0800 0665358 number and providing a rough sleeping location.

They are able to help all clients in an outreach capacity. This is usually on the streets, so easier to adhere to PHE guidelines.

They continue to work in partnership with other support services, so may see clients at the Archer Project, Bens Centre or any other locations to get support and a continuity of care for their clients.

For self-referrals, St Wilfrid's Centre can offer food, showers, clothes and advice/signposting, if clients present themselves at the Centre within the opening times. They are open to clients who normally attend day service to come for specific sessions, adhering to government and public health guidelines. They are continuing to provide an outreach service to all their established clients. They are not able to take on any new formal referrals for day service activities at present.

Clients are not able to come into the office but doorstep support will be provided and takeaway supplies (food parcels, condoms, needle x-change, etc).

Also operating a community outreach approach and delivering food parcels and supplies to clients' accommodation - this is reviewed weekly.

At the moment, regular one to one appointments are being held via telephone.

Drop in sessions for maximum 5 clients will soon be held outdoors at parks etc.

Outreach van is operating 3x weekly (3 hour sessions). Clients can't come onto the van at moment but are able to get food, condoms and needle x-change.

Referrals are open as usual. If somebody is sex working on the street, at home or over the internet, they can contact them for support.

Ben's Centre

Ben's Centre is open as a limited day centre from the 16th November to existing and potentially new clients. Please note their new address is 22 Wilkinson Street, S10 2GB, situated just off Hanover way, near Sainsburys.

They are now providing light lunches to existing and new clients until their new kitchen is organised and ready to cook hot food.

Outreach patrols will be running every weekday from the 16th November.

They are still open as a donation centre and will deliver housing providers and other agencies with enrichment items as and when they need them.

Offering breakfast and lunch via gates Monday-Friday 8.30-1.00 (last meal served at 12.45pm).

Good News Café and Revive are operating on Saturdays at the same time, however they are not able to allow people into the building.

As the Sunday Centre is providing hot takeaway meals, there isn't any provision on a Sunday at the Archer Project.

There is access to toilets, showers, laundry, use of the telephone, computer and 1:1 support available for people who are rough sleeping and/or without benefits.

Unable to provide dentist service at the moment due to Covid restrictions.

People can use the Archer Project for virtual surgeries with their GP. They will need to speak to a member of the team to arrange to use this service.

Sunday Centre

Serving take-away food at the George Street entrance to the Victoria Hall - usual entrance.

Offering take-away food (a hot meat/hot veggie meal) and a small food bag - fruit, choc, biscuits, etc.

Unable to offer hot or cold drinks, but able to provide bottled water to give out on request.

Currently handing out disposable face masks.

The Hall is completely closed to visitors so there is no access to toilets.

The continuation of this service/support will be dependent on being able to demonstrate Covid compliance by volunteers and by clients – this will be reviewed regularly to assess if this support can continue in this format.

Sunday Centre is also offering a "Walk and Talk" Service. This is a scheme where two volunteers walk the parts of the city centre where those who use the Sunday Centre tend to hang out. It is an effort to do something to tackle loneliness and isolation. Service aims to go out most days but is dependent on availability of volunteers as their safeguarding & safety procedures requires to work in a team of two.

Wednesday Night Soup kitchen

Helping with 'Meals on Wheels' by coordinating preparation and distribution of packed lunches operating from Archer Project to support people placed in hostels commissioned by Sheffield City Council due to Covid-19 government guidance.

Leading on the 2020 Christmas Shoe Box Appeal. Every Christmas, homeless people not only have to deal with the fact that they are homeless as well as other issues, but also have to deal with the "happy" part of the year, sometimes alone. Aiming to ensure everyone gets a present to open this Christmas and bring some cheer to the most vulnerable adults in Sheffield.

If anyone calls the Centre, a doctor will phone them back on the same day. If that doctor needs to see them face to face this will be arranged at Hanover or Devonshire Green Medical Centres. They can video consult if anyone has the equipment to do this.

Video consultations are up and running weekly at Salvation Army, Archer Project and other services.

The Centre is pro-actively trying to contact people where there are health needs they know about, so letting them have an up to date phone number is really helpful.

They work very close with the street outreach nurse and HAST (Homeless Assessment and Support Team).

Minor aliment treatment and sign

posting/referral to other services.

Wednesday - 6am Street out reach with Framework. Visit hotels with RSI Team to offer physical health advice and information, minor aliment treatment and sign posting/referral to other services.

Thursday - 8am virtual clinics as above and supporting Devonshire Green GP pilot scheme currently in place. Visit Quality hotel with HAST team 1-4:30pm.

At present, she is working with Archer Project, Victoria Court, 911 and others to offer flu immunisations if clients are happy to have this.

She can immunise anyone in these groups who are registered with Devonshire Green Medical Centre, and anyone rough sleeping who is not registered with them can be given a voucher to have a flu jab at Boots High Street.

Anyone who is registered with another GP and still in contact with them should be approaching their own GP for this.

People are eligible for free flu jabs if they have a condition such as asthma on a brown inhaler, COPD, diabetes, heart disease, liver disease.
