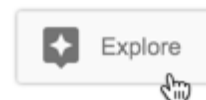

In this lesson activity students will each add a blank slide to the collaborative Google Slides presentation. Suggestion to have students put their name in the speaker notes at the bottom.

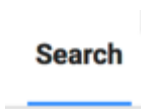
What are students doing on the slide?

Tip: Encourage students to use the Explore tool in the bottom right to help them visually, clearly communicate their ideas.



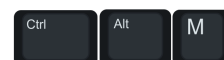
How are students making a decision?

Tip: Allow students to add a picture they took (Instagram or Snapchat option for older students) or use the Insert menu to add an image and use the Search option to add a picture.



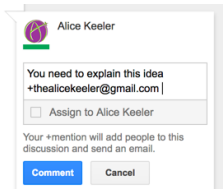
What type of feedback will the students be giving?

Tip: Collaborating is not the same as cooperating. Students should be interacting and having discussions around each other's work, not simply adding their work to a presentation. Try having students use the keyboard shortcut Control Alt M to insert a feedback comment on another slide.



How will you (teacher) help develop students feedback skills?

Tip: Try replying to student feedback comments with questions to further their thinking. Use a plus mention (+emailaddress) in the feedback comment to direct the comment to a specific student.



Why will students find this engaging and not just busywork?

Tip: It's hard to make an engaging lesson kids care about. Don't have ego about it, ask the students and think of ways to incorporate things they are familiar with.
