(From TVOLearn) An infographic is a visual representation of data that is intended to make the data easy to understand. Infographics may include some combination of charts, diagrams, illustrations, and text, along with graphic design elements. Plank Challenge Set a timer and go into plank position. Lay on the floor PHYS ED with hands shoulder length apart. Life your body up so only your toes and hands are on the ground. Your body should be flat in the air with your core engaged. See how long you can last for! 2. Jumping Jack Challenge See how many jumping jacks you can complete in a row. Ensure to fully extend your arms over the head and to lift your feet from the ground with each jump. 3. **Tissue Challenge** Hold one arm out high above your head holding the tissue. Drop the tissue and with your other hand try to catch it before the tissue gets below your knees. Ensure to time yourself for 1 min and see how many catches you get! What other modifications can you do to make it more challenging? (Switch hands, Catch it with your foot etc). Create a 10 minute fitness routine using equipment available at home. The goal would be to raise your heart rate, repeat the routine 3x a day. Teach someone else in your household your routine. California 2) Wadi Rum desert in Jordan 3) Tropical Rainforest in Northern Thailand 4) Rainforest in Sooke British Columbia For each environment, consider the following questions: - What is a challenge presented by this environment? What is an opportunity presented by this environment? Record your responses orally, digitally, in print, or in a method of your choice. ART Art is a form of communication. Participating in art through exposure and creation gives people the opportunity to express themselves and to learn about others. Art can be a communication outlet for anyone, as it allows us all to communicate through images and stories. What is self-expression?

Self-expression is the sharing of one's thoughts, feelings, and/or ideas within art, music, dance, or writing. Expressing yourself is important, and art is a great outlet for sharing thoughts and feelings.
