This is a public domain photograph from the Farm Security Administration/Office of War Information Color Photographs Collection in the Library of Congress.


As far as great public domain stock images go, this is one of the best. Jack Delano, working for the FSA, captured a carnival barker surrounded by his circus accoutrement. A sign to the left of the podium reads, "See Teddy the Wrestling Bear," while one above implies that a 618 lb. snake is waiting inside. This is a colorful stock image with great potential. A live pelican also makes an appearance in this photograph.
