Program Description

The Bachelor in Aviation Management at HBI University prepares students for a career in the aviation industry, focusing on the management of air transport, airline operations, and aviation logistics. This program provides students with the skills to effectively manage aviation businesses, operations, and safety systems.

The Minor in Faith-Based Air Transport and Humanitarian Aid enhances this degree by integrating faith-based perspectives into the use of aviation for humanitarian relief and crisis management. Students will explore how aviation can support global humanitarian efforts, from disaster relief operations to airlift coordination for faith-based organizations.

Capstone Project (15 Credit Hours)

The capstone project in Aviation Management allows students to apply aviation operations, humanitarian logistics, and faith-based air transport solutions to real-world scenarios. Students will:

- Develop a strategic plan for the use of air transport in a humanitarian aid mission.
- Conduct research on ethical and logistical challenges in air transport during disaster relief.
- Create an operational model for a faith-based organization's air transport coordination.
- Present findings through a written report and project presentation.

Program Outcomes

Graduates of this program will:

- Master aviation management practices, including airline operations and safety.
- Integrate faith-based perspectives into air transport for humanitarian aid and disaster relief.
- Develop sustainable aviation logistics strategies for faith-based organizations.
- Lead air transport operations for humanitarian organizations and nonprofit sectors.
- Apply advanced problem-solving skills in crisis management and global airlift coordination.
