

Mentoring and support

Using data from internal assessments, the more able co-ordinator selects pupils to meet with during Lesson 0 where they feel guidance and mentoring is required.

Here are some examples of what students might also have access to as part of their provision:

- *Q&A with an access officer from Oxford University*
- *Presentations aiming to demystify University*
- *Advice on how to choose A-Levels (Cambridge University Outreach)*
- *Super-Curricular Activities*
- *Self-reflection on recent reports and goal-setting*
- *Unifrog futures and careers sessions during Lesson 0*

These pupils will also have access to a dedicated Google Classroom which is updated regularly with opportunities such as; online courses, summer schools, university webinars, open days, lectures and work experience.
