CURRICULUM

Course levels offered at KPRHS

Advanced Placement (AP): High academic goals with extensive home study and independent research.

Honors (H): High academic goals with considerable home study and independent research.

Standard (formerly College Preparatory): Above average academic goals with home study and independent research. These course levels meet the Massachusetts standards for college preparation.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

King Philip offers full year and semester based courses. Students receive 1 credit for a full year course and 0.5 credits for a semester course upon successful completion. Twenty-four (24) credits are required for graduation in the following subject areas:
