Seeing the questions will help us to understand more clearly the author, the recipients and the purpose of writing. The following points are taken into account:

- 1. Identify who asks the question (God, author or addressee).
- 2. The question is answered or is a rhetorical question.
- 3. The question affirms or defines the author's purpose.
