

Creabting With Collage

Supply List

Collage is automatic and intuitive. I don't do a lot of planning when I collage, but if you are a planner, have a sketchbook or journal for ideas.

For first class bring these items.

(This is the core of what you will need for class)

-substrate: this could be Bristol board or/and any cards you may have to repurpose (old birthday cards, postcards) you have on hand, or canvass board or repurposed watercolor paintings.

*-a non toxic glue stick preferably UHU
scissors. (fiskars are great. I like fiskars kid scissors)*

-a ruler if you have it

-If you have white glue (Elmers or tacky glue) bring it. If you have gel medium that is an option too.

-Magazine with big images

and any fun papers you have such as Asian papers, old artwork, scrapbook paper, Sometimes junk mail has fun colored envelopes.

A ruler if you have it. (A record album or a book could work as a straight edge.)

Class Supplies

Supplies: College is very personal and I am listing things I like to use.

Don't go out and buy a lot of stuff.

The most important things are

Adhesives: -UHU glue sticks

matt or gel medium or mod podge if you have it on hand

scissors and or exacto knives

Substrates: This is the surface you collage on

- Bristol board, your old paintings, watercolor paper, repurposed junk mail, canvas board, wooden board

papers:

scrapbook paper, old magazines, wrapping paper, tissue paper,
Asian/South Asian papers, wallpaper samples, old photos, letters, cards,
maps, photocopies, books, maps
your own drawings, paintings, prints that you are ready to repurpose

Additional materials you can use if have them on hand**paints, inks**

Watercolors (preferred)
acrylic paints,
water based block printing ink brushes
brayers, speedball inks
Brushes
Salt
Bubble wrap
containers
stamps and stamp pads
Stencils, stamps and inks

Additional adhesives and supplies

double sided tape (preferably acid free or archival)
White glue (Elmers) PVA glue
matt medium and or gel medium
tacky glue, needle and thread,
inexpensive brushes for glues and mediums

E6000 is a heavy duty glue that can adhere to some 3D items. It is not toxic.

random stuff:

fabric scraps, ribbon, mesh, lace, feathers

old photos

found objects

recycled containers for water or to thin mediums, glues and or paints.

Textured items,

Random tools

Tweezers

A brayer

A small cutting mat (helpful if you like to use X-acto knives)
