Name of Course: Algebraic Foundations

**Catalog Description**: The course examines fundamental concepts of algebra and is equivalent to second year high school algebra. Concepts include polynomial expressions and factoring, rational expressions, radical expressions, and quadratic expressions. (Not applicable toward a baccalaureate degree.)

### **Learning Outcomes:**

Upon successful completion of this course the student should be able to:

- 1. Evaluate and simplify Exponential Expressions using appropriate properties
- 2. Define and simplify polynomial, rational and radical expressions/functions
- 3. Determine which factoring method to apply and factor polynomial expressions
- 4. Solve quadratic equations algebraically
- 5. Solve applications of quadratic, rational and radical equations
- 6. Develop the ability to communicate mathematical ideas, problem solving techniques, and reasoning by the appropriate use of English language, mathematical notation, and mathematical diagrams in the solution of selected problems.
- 7. Develop the ability to evaluate own work by the means of reasoning, checking and/or tracing the steps.
