Handbook Highlights

REQUIRED: Handbook Acknowledgement Signature

All St. James Regional parents and students are required to read and agree to the policies set forth in the Parent/Student Handbook and its appendices. Please log into OptionC and sign the eForm ASAP. Thank you to those families who have already done this.

Dress Code

Neatness and cleanliness in personal attire are part of a child's education and the responsibility of the parents. Students are expected to come to school well-groomed as good grooming leads to personal self-respect and effective academic performance. Students should have no visible dirt on their clothing or skin. When a child looks and feels good about himself/herself, he/she acts and works to the best of their ability. Any student not in compliance with the dress code will be subject to a conduct notice. Personal appearances that constitute distraction are not permitted. Final approval/disapproval is at the discretion of the principal.

HAIR STYLES/GROOMING

• Hair is to be neatly groomed and styled in a conservative manner.

- Girls with longer hair should use a simple, basic headband or non decorative barrettes to keep it out of their eyes.
- Boys' hair should be cut to keep it out of the eyes and above the collar.
- Hair is to be natural in color with no streaks, tips, or dyes that are not of a natural hair color
- Hair is to be trimmed in such a way that it does not fall into one's eyes

MAKE-UP AND NAIL POLISH:

- Students, no matter the grade, are not permitted to wear make-up
- Nails are to be of a modest, natural length; fake nails and nail tips are not permitted
- Nail polish, if worn, should be of a <u>light</u>, neutral color; bright or dark colored nails are not permitted
- Tattoos are not permitted and students should refrain from writing on their skin with pencils, markers, etc.

JEWELRY

- Girls only small post earrings are permitted ONE in each ear only
- Boys are not permitted to wear earrings
- No additional body piercings are permitted
- Small, religious medals are permitted as a necklace, but must be tucked into the uniform shirt.
- No other jewelry, including rings or bracelets are permitted

WATCHES

- Simple watches with no alarms are permitted
- Smart watches must be in "school mode" or do not disturb mode to prevent texting during the school day. If a student is found to have a smartwatch that is capable of receiving text messages. accessing the internet, or playing games during school hours the teacher or other adult will take the watch. The watch can be picked up by the student in the Main Office at the completion of afternoon prayer.
