Program Description

The Bachelor of Strategic Leadership with a Minor in Jewish Studies: Leadership and Ethics at HBIU University is designed to equip students with the knowledge and skills required to lead organizations, manage teams, and create sustainable change through effective strategic leadership. The minor in Jewish Studies adds a unique focus on Jewish ethical principles, moral decision-making, and leadership philosophy, enabling students to incorporate timeless Jewish teachings into their leadership practices.

The Minor in Jewish Studies: Leadership and Ethics emphasizes Jewish perspectives on leadership and ethical decision-making. Students will explore the ethical dilemmas faced by leaders in both secular and faith-based settings, studying biblical values, leadership models, and Jewish law as they relate to leadership and management. The minor prepares students for leadership roles where they can integrate ethical leadership with Jewish moral principles, particularly in non-profit, community, and faith-based organizations.

Graduates will be prepared for leadership roles across a variety of sectors, including business, community development, non-profit management, and faith-based organizations, all with a strong foundation in Jewish ethical leadership.

- Present findings and recommendations through a formal report and presentation.

This experience ensures students graduate with practical expertise in strategic leadership and Jewish ethical decision-making.
