Phonics

- From Amy Grant: Rather than using the color vowel system, Amy developed a system
 with keywords that use the vowel as the initial sound, when possible. That seems
 far easier for students (especially pre-literate and dyslexic students) to understand.
 Here are:
 - The <u>slides</u> that I use to teach & practice the vowel sounds (one sound at a time -not all at once)
 - Spelling patterns <u>video</u> for the short & long A sounds (Æ-like-APPLE and AY-like-APRIL)
 - Spelling patterns <u>video</u> for the short & long E sounds (EH-like-EXIT and EE-like-EAT)
 - Spelling patterns <u>video</u> for the short & long I sounds (IH-like-ITCHY and AYE-like-ICE)
 - Spelling patterns <u>video</u> for the short & long O sounds and broad A (AH-like-OLIVE and OH-like-OPEN)
 - Spelling patterns <u>video</u> for the short & long U sounds and the *uh* sound of O (UH-like-UP and OO-like-UBER)

The other vowel sound keywords that I use are:

- ARM for the R-controlled sound of AR
- PURPLE for the R-controlled sounds of ER, IR, UR (and sometimes OR and EAR)
 (video)
- ORANGE for the R-controlled sound of OR (video)
- OIL for the OI/OY sound
- OUCH for the OU/OW sound (video)
- GOOD for the short OO sound (video)
