pronoun types	
pronoun	a word that takes the place of a noun
antecedent	the noun that the pronoun refers to
interrogative	used to ask a question (who, what, whose, whom, which)
demonstrative	points out the noun w/out actually naming it; they demonstrate the noun (that, this, these, those)
reflexive	refers back to the subject (myself, himself, herself, itself, yourself)
intensive	same as reflexive only it is used for extra emphasis
indefinite	does not refer to any specific person, thing or amount; it is vague & is not definite
relative	introduces a group of words that act as adjectives
possessive	shows possession
personal	refers to people
1st person pronoun	person speaking
2nd person pronoun	person being spoken to
3rd person pronoun	person/thing spoken about
