

## pronoun types

<b>pronoun</b>	a word that takes the place of a noun
<b>antecedent</b>	the noun that the pronoun refers to
<b>interrogative</b>	used to ask a question (who, what, whose, whom, which)
<b>demonstrative</b>	points out the noun w/out actually naming it; they demonstrate the noun (that, this, these, those)
<b>reflexive</b>	refers back to the subject (myself, himself, herself, itself, yourself)
<b>intensive</b>	same as reflexive only it is used for extra emphasis
<b>indefinite</b>	does not refer to any specific person, thing or amount; it is vague & is not definite
<b>relative</b>	introduces a group of words that act as adjectives
<b>possessive</b>	shows possession
<b>personal</b>	refers to people
<b>1st person pronoun</b>	person speaking
<b>2nd person pronoun</b>	person being spoken to
<b>3rd person pronoun</b>	person/thing spoken about
