UMPIRES CORNER Thanks to Kim Stewart

When will a game be forfeited to your opponents?

The Law of Bowls provides a number of circumstances when a game will be forfeited to the opponents of a player or team that has not complied with the Laws. These include:-

- 1. When positions within the team are changed after the first end (unless the change is necessary because of the introduction of a substitute). Law 11.2;
- 2. When a player changes the bowls they are using during an uninterrupted game, or during a game that was stopped because of darkness, weather conditions etc. but then continued on the same day. Law 29.3.;
- 3. When no eligible substitute is available to fill the position of a player in a team game who has to leave the green due to illness or some other reasonable cause and who cannot return within 10 minutes. Law 33. (This also applies when a player in a Singles game has to leave under the same circumstances);
- 4. If a team introduces a player that the Controlling Body of the Competition decides is ineligible for some reason stipulated in the Law of Bowls. Law 39.1.
