I am seeking representation for my 32k word middle grade contemporary, What Stars Are Made Of. This story will appeal to fans of R.J. Palacio, Kate Messner, and Gary Schmidt. I have been fortunate enough to work with Amanda Hill and Cindy Baldwin on this manuscript, and they recommended I send a query to you.

Libby (age twelve) has a rare genetic condition called Turner Syndrome. This means things like being born with an oversized heart, taking daily growth hormone shots, and not doing the monkey bars very well. But it doesn't mean she won't get an A+ in biology or be a scientist when she grows up.

Usually Libby doesn't think Turner Syndrome is that big of a deal, but then Libby's hero--her big sister--comes to town with a gigantic surprise: she's pregnant, and she's staying with the family while her husband finishes basic training. Libby knows all about the many things that can go wrong with a pregnancy (like miscarriages or genetic disorders and oversized hearts). So Libby makes a deal with her other hero, overlooked astronomer Cecilia Payne, who discovered what stars are made of. Libby imagines Cecilia as basically her guardian angel of science. Libby promises to bring Cecilia the credit she deserves by getting her into the next edition of their textbook, if Cecilia will take care of things from the other side. If she'll make sure the new baby is born safe, healthy, and perfect. With an Apgar score of ten. (A+ in biology, see?)

But if Libby's going to get these textbook people to take her seriously, she's going to need more creativity and tenacity than she's ever needed in her life. She won't give up, though, because failure means her sister could get hurt, maybe hurt bad. Failure means the baby could be born damaged or messed up. Like her.

I have been published in The Evansville Review, Allegory, WritersDigest.com, and have upcoming work in Cicada magazine. I also received an MFA from Brigham Young University. Like Libby, I was born with Turner Syndrome. (Hooray #ownvoices! And the daily shots actually weren't too bad.)
