Project Aims

The purpose of the project is to research, create, test and validate content for ethics classes that introduce EA ideas to high-school and/or secondary school students.

Agent histories

- As a teacher, I want course content for the ethics classes I teach that is engaging to students, and also relevant to the aims of the class.
- As a student, I want classes to be interesting, fun and engaging.

Sub goals

- Determine criteria for good course content
- Identify potential risks of the project, and propose mitigation strategies.
- Determine suitable EA ideas to introduce to students.
- Incorporate EA ideas in an outline for an ethics course that fulfills the aims of ethics classes in upper secondary schools and/or high-schools, including learning goals and curricular goals.
- Test the course materials in schools, with the permission of teachers.



• Incorporate learnings to further improve the materials.

What should we avoid?

Risks for negative side effects

- Avoid, by any means possible, a bad episode with minors.
- Avoid mentioning any EA organizations explicitly.
- Avoid damaging the reputation of EA in any way
- Avoid coming off as arrogant
- Make sure not to misrepresent EA ideas

Project plan

Expertise

- Basic research expertise. Being able to google stuff, read papers and forum posts, and boil ideas down to the essentials.
- Teaching skills or experience is a plus
- Good writing skills is a plus

Activities

- Help Paal and Anders research questions to do with the pathways to impact and risk mitigation.
 - Draw pathways to impact in a diagram-format in https://excalidraw.com/.
 - Identify links or claims that seem unclear or insecure, and research these points to establish a knowledge base about them.
- Develop course content for ethics classes on consequentialism
 - Help Paal and Anders research best pedagogical practices
 - Evaluate different angles on the content side
 - Evaluate different formats for teaching
- Test the content at high-schools.
 - Ask teachers if you can come to their school to hold a lesson on the ethics of consequentialism, testing the content out.
 - Document findings, and write a report on the basis of learnings.
