ATI TEAS - Fall 2024 Admissions

TEAS is a computerized test composed of multiple-choice questions organized into four sections, which measure reading, mathematics skills, science and English grammar. The test takes about 4 hours to complete and is offered on the Lynn or Danvers campus. **TEAS tests for all programs must be taken in person at an authorized ATI testing center.** Remote test scores will not be accepted

EXEMPTIONS

A Bachelor of Science degree and grades of C or better in A&P 1 and 2 exempts students from taking the TEAS for NSG, OTA, PNR, RAD, and SRT. The A&P grade of C or better must within 10 years for NSG, RAD and SRT. A Bachelor of Science degree alone exempts PTA and RSP students from taking the TEAS. See chart above.

ELIGIBILITY

Students may only take the test a total of three (3) times in the academic year (Sept 1 – August 31). Students whose score reports reflect that they have tested more than 3 times must also submit an official TEAS Transcript from ATI: http://www.atitesting.com/ati_store/.

REGISTERING and PAYING FOR THE TEST

Students should prepare for the exam early and register to take the test as soon as they feel prepared. **Registrations are final.**

To view available testing dates, register and pay:

- Go to www.atitesting.com and log in or create an ATI account if you do not already have one.
- Click "Online Store"
- Select TEAS for Nursing or TEAS for Allied Health (they are the same but dates may be different).
- Choose Massachusetts and then select Danvers or Lynn.
- Select your test date and enter your credit card information. The fee is \$106 per test.
- You will need your ATI Username and Password on the date of testing.

SCORING

Students receive their individual ATI TEAS score reports immediately upon completion of the exam. Students can also access their score reports by logging into www.atitesting.com and clicking My Results. Students must upload a copy of the scores with their completed application packet.

RETEST POLICY

Applicants may take the test a TOTAL of three (3) times in the academic year prior to submitting their application. If a student takes the test a 4th time, the Admissions office will deem these scores invalid and testing fees will not be refunded.

ACCOMMODATIONS

ACADEMIC DISHONESTY

Students who fail to comply with the rules of remote testing face disciplinary action according to ATI and NSCC student guidelines.

Day of Testing

Report to room LS215 (Lynn) or DB213 (Danvers) at least 15 minutes prior to test start time. Students who arrive late will not be admitted to the test and must pay the testing fee to reschedule.

The following are required for admission to your TEAS session:

- A government issued photo ID (ie driver's license)
- Your ATI username and password
- Nothing is allowed with you in the test room. Lockers are available to lock your belongings.

TEAS tests for all NSCC programs must be taken in person at an authorized ATI testing center. Remote test scores will not be accepted.
