

Big Ideas and Events

- Resident will have another (5-7 day) takeover. Mentor should be out of room as much as possible
- Regular rounds will be inconsistent in January due to takeovers, in-person courses as UoP, and ARE meetings.
- All residents will be at University of the Pacific in Stockton from 1/27-2/4.
- This begins the golden season where residents can lead small groups, help individuals, and work as a capable teacher without the stresses that are coming. Take advantage of this time to really push students.
