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Course Description:

Breakdown:

Practice (10%)

- Assignments (combination of online Aleks assignments, textbook problems and worksheets) will be given daily and are due the following day.
- Late assignments must be submitted by the end of each grading period.
- Any formative assignments, including exit tickets, group work, etc.... may be included in this category.
- Practice is an essential key to learning and is imperative for students to be successful in this class.
