Value of an Action Plan:

- **Provides Clarity and Focus:**
 - A plan of action outlines specific steps and tasks needed to achieve a goal, preventing ambiguity and ensuring team members identify common goals.
- **Enhances Efficiency:**
 - By breaking down large goals into smaller, manageable steps, a plan of action allows for efficient resource allocation and task prioritization.
- **Improves Decision-Making:**
 - A well-defined action plan is essential to making informed decisions by considering potential roadblocks and alternative courses of action.
- **Facilitates Tracking and Evaluation:**
 - It enables tracking progress, monitoring results, and making necessary adjustments along the way, ensuring that the project stays on course.

The 2026-2027 GSPP Action Plan is due to your Regional Technical Assistance Center on October 1, 2026.
