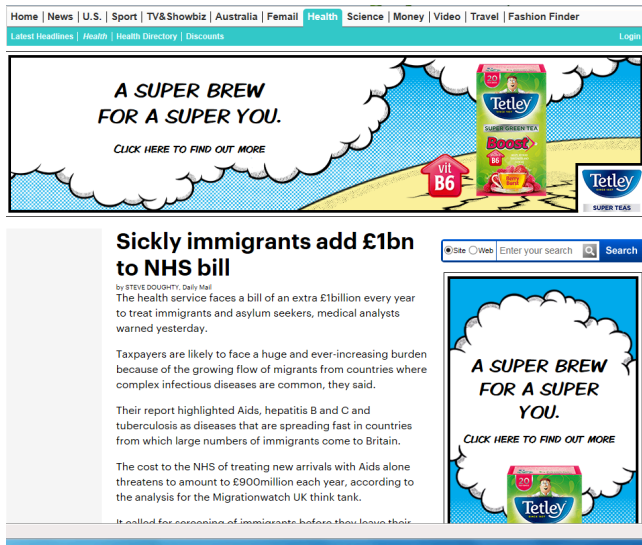


Right wing- Against immigration (The daily mail)
