- **November 7, 2024** (with continued professional learning sessions Nov. 8-10th)
 - In collaboration with the California Association of Science Educators (CASE), the CAL-MSCS Science Steering Team will launch the first in-person convening of the Science Community of Practice (SCOP) on Thursday, November 7th with a full day of programming for Local Implementation Team representatives <u>from every</u> <u>county office of education</u>.
 - Additional learning sessions connected to the November 7th launch and led by Science Steering Team members and partners will continue throughout the CASE Annual Conference (Nov. 8th-10th).
 - Our closing keynote speaker on Sunday, November 10th, Dr. Christopher Emdin, will help inspire and connect themes from the November 7th launch and the CASE Annual Conference. The CAL-MSCS Science Steering Team is thrilled to co-sponsor Dr. Emdin in collaboration with CASE!
 - CISC Science Subcommittee members attending the November 6th in-person meeting are encouraged to extend their stay throughout the SCOP launch on November 7th and subsequent CASE learning sessions given the connections between our statewide science work.

Attendee Information

To maximize impact at the local level and facilitate integrity of implementation of Action Plan B, we strongly encourage each COE to bring a diverse team of representatives from their CAL-MSCS <u>Local Implementation Team</u> to *each* in- person convening of the SCOP. Please note that the number of representatives allocated to each COE is constrained by available conference venue space.

As you consider who to invite to participate in our statewide Science offerings, reflect upon the Action Plan B goals you will focus on to improve your local system of support, as well as any Action Plan A assets, needs, curiosities or concerns you might want to leverage or address in your Science support efforts moving forward. Aim for diversity of perspective, role, and organizational affiliation. For example, the SJCOE team plans to bring two COE STEM coordinators, one elementary teacher leader, two district Science specialists, and one

community partner from a local expanded learning network to represent their broader Local Implementation Team.

Funding Support & Suggestions

Local Implementation Teams in every county will be supported with additional funding to facilitate diverse participation in 2024/2025 SCOP convenings. We do not anticipate having additional funding to supplement contracts in 2025/2026 and 2026/2027.

A separate contract with the SJCOE for the amount up to \$8,000 will be distributed to each COE to support Local Implementation Team attendance to the 2024/2025 SCOPs. These contracts will begin July 1, 2024 and will stipulate that the funding is to support travel and attendance to the CAL-MSCS Science COPs.

As the first in-person convening of the SCOP will be in collaboration with CASE, we recognize the cost to participate in the full program will be slightly higher than it will be for subsequent SCOP convenings. We hope the supplemental funding helps to alleviate this cost for Local Implementation Teams. Please see the table below to learn more about Fall 2024 SCOP registration costs and options.

Registration Guidance for the Fall SCOP Convening

Local Implementation Team members, including COE representatives, should register for the Fall SCOP convening utilizing the *CAL-MSCS Science Community of Practice Registration Link*. A special registration link was sent out to our CAL-MSCS distribution list mid August. Please connect with your COE lead to obtain the registration link. When using this special link, individuals will be asked to identify their county office of education affiliation, and will then be provided with the discounted rates shown in the table above (\$150 or \$400 bundle). Please note that conference housing rates do not apply to individuals who plan on only attending the SCOP on November 7th. A list of nearby hotels can be provided upon request.

*CASE Conference presenters are granted an *already discounted* speaker rate. Please reach out to admin@cascience.org with questions and support on registration. The CASE Conference team will be able to work with your office on any special registration scenarios and discounts.

Each COE will ultimately need to determine how Local Implementation Team members should be invited, registered and reimbursed for the November in-person convening of the SCOP. We recommend inviting science leaders and partners that are best positioned to help teams generate and disseminate professional learning opportunities, strengthen the engagement of families, caregivers and community partners in science learning, and ultimately, address Action Plan B goals.
