Schools

Club contact with schools has continued to include encouragement with environmental projects. 2 composting bins were purchased and a number of plants delivered. Still no uptake with the Young Environmentalist competition.

Tree Planting

More trees for the Tove Valley Centre have been ordered from Woodland Trust through their free trees for community projects. 105 saplings will be used to re-establish a hedge by the main road.

The Rotary coordinated Treekly tree planting project has been joined by several club members and a team of 5 completed the Treekly Challenge which resulted in the planting of 190 trees.

We have been intouch with Rotary contacts who are trialing 'More Trees Now' - an idea to harvest self seeded saplings from forests.
