
10. How does the Scarsdale School District school budget compare to similar district school budgets?

Expenditures and Revenues

11. What expense items are the largest percent of the budget?

Over 80% of the budget is determined by state requirements or collective bargaining contracts. Instruction (57%) and Undistributed (28%) expenses represent the largest percentages of budgetary expenditures.

Instruction includes teachers' salaries, which must be established through collective bargaining under the <u>Taylor Law</u>, also known as <u>The Public Employees' Fair Employment Act</u>, which has

been in effect since September 1, 1967. Instruction expenses also include administration and program development, instructional technology support, and student services.

12. How many unions are there in the Scarsdale School District?


There are seven unions in Scarsdale, representing administrators, teachers, teacher aids and other supporting staff respectively. The Scarsdale Board of Education engages in collective bargaining with those seven separate units. The most current contract with each may be found here, along with supporting documents, as applicable.

13. What measures are being taken to control health insurance costs?

According to the <u>Scarsdale School Administration</u>, "since 1989, the District has operated a self-insured, employee health plan that has proven to be both economical and efficient. It features low overhead, services that are paid for only when used, and the ability to adjust benefits in response to emerging conditions. Employees share in the increasing cost of healthcare through monthly contributions and co-pays. While the plan has been cost-effective over time, it can be volatile in the short-term, depending on annual claims. The District continues to strive to contain costs in the context of a challenging healthcare market."


14. What revenues fund Scarsdale schools?

The six sources of revenue that are available to support budget expenditures are: state aid, prior year surplus, county sales tax, transfer from reserves, other receipts, and property taxes. In 2021-2022, 93% of the revenues are from local property taxes.

16. What is the Scarsdale School District's credit rating?

A <u>credit rating</u> is an independent assessment of the probability of default and severity of loss of a bond issuer. The credit rating influences the price at which a municipality, such as a school district, can issue bonds to finance its needs.

Scarsdale School's General Obligation Bonds are rated Aaa by Moody's Investors Services. A <u>Aaa rating</u> is the highest rating assigned to bonds, which have the least probability of default and the least loss severity should an issuer default. Moody's last affirmed this rating for Scarsdale School District in June 2021; click <u>here</u> for the press release.
