In this final session for the day, participants will first explore an effective model for multi-system coordination that the Ohio Family and Children's First Council has used for the last 15 years. Then, facilitators will guide small group discussions based on their community context - metro, mid-size and rural. Groups will identify the cross over of services between adults and youth, necessary differences in systems and services, and gaps that community services can fill through coordination of services for young adults ages 18-25. Each context will wrap up with facilitated reporting from small groups to the larger context group on three things they identified in crossover services, gaps, and coordinated services opportunities.. The session will end with a final open discussion on: "What is the first step you are going to take toward the long-term goal of serving and supporting young adults returning home?"
