## Community/Ward Rep Updates

## From Chris Antonik:

Chris had a call with Ward 9 Trustee Alexis Dawson on October 15th. Here's his report

- Phone chat went well; good rapport building; Alexis very encouraged we've got a Ward rep!
- In general, Ward Council forums are Alexis's preferred way of working with SACs (as she can interact with them all more broadly), however, we are also welcome to reach out to her anytime.
  - Expects to hold a Ward Council forum every 6-weeks
  - Date for first meeting will be announced soon
  - First meeting will include the Superintendents introducing themselves, and election of PIAC reps (the super school council); she'd be looking for 2 volunteers for 2-year terms.
  - Ward forums are open to the public
- Ways in which Dovercourt SAC could support Alexis. Have committed to get back to Alexis on the following two items:
  - Alexis asked DPS SAC to identify the kinds of advocacy our school parent community would be looking for this year (key priorities) e.q., class sizes, budget, other specific issues.
    - Suggest we debate these at the November SAC meeting.
  - Would like to learn about DPS' commitment to Truth and Reconciliation, i.e., current/planned initiatives in the school.
- The #1 issue for Alexis is dealing with current geopolitical issues, and how
  to discuss them in the classroom as schools await direction from the
  ministry. This is taking a lot of her time. She noted that it's mostly parents
  (not students) that are raising the issue—she just wants all children to feel
  a sense of belonging.
