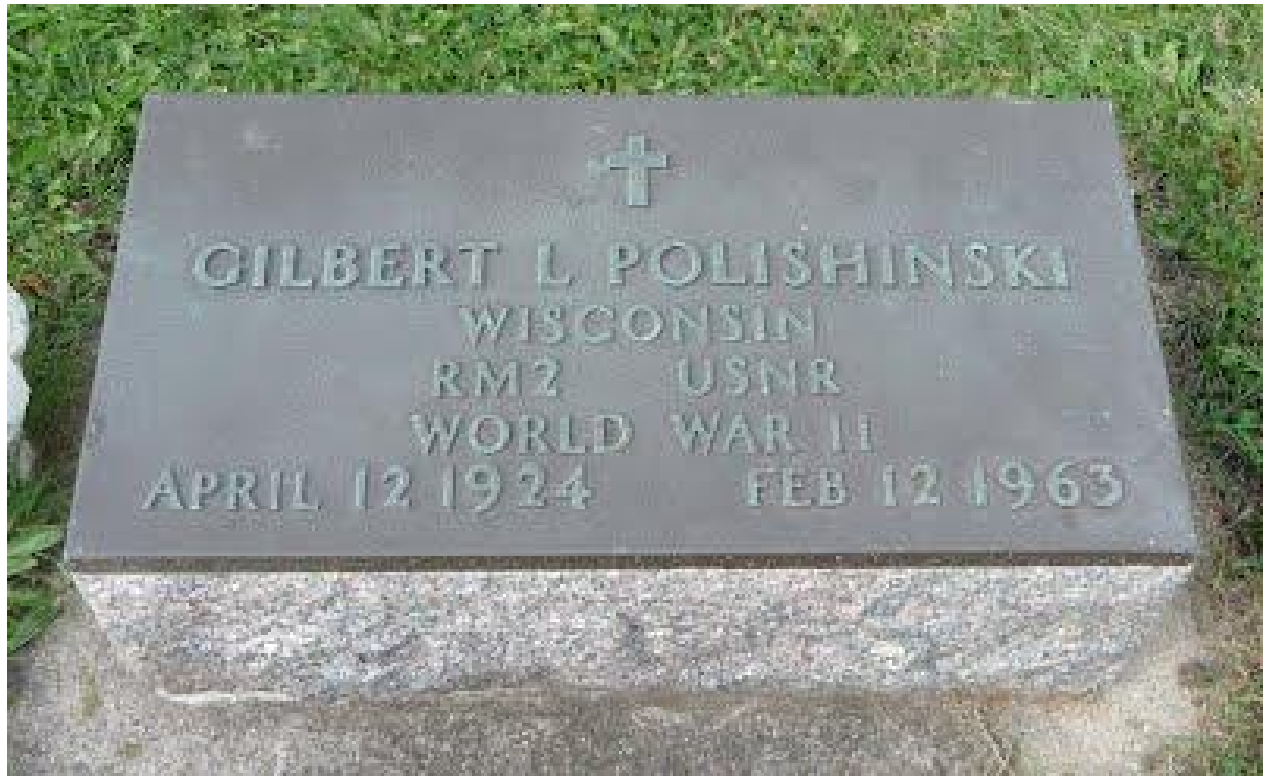

Gilbert L. Polishinski, 33, of 2836 Fond du Lac Rd., died today at 5:10 a.m. at the veterans hospital in Madison. A patient there five days, he had been ill two weeks.

He was born in Oshkosh on April 12, 1924, son of Leo and Bertha Polishinski, and was married in Dubuque, Iowa, to Miss Jean Paulsen on Sept. 29, 1957.
