We were honoured to welcome Lt. Colonel Caleb Walker (ret.) and Major Patrick Dornan to share their experiences and powerful messages.

As Lt. Colonel Walker (ret.) shared with Kinder and primary students:

"One of the biggest lessons I learned as a solider is how important it is to be kind and to help each other - just like you might help a friend who falls down or share your snack with someone who forgot theirs. Even small things can make a difference... Remembrance Day is not just about remembering the past - it's also about thinking about the world we want to live in today and tomorrow. A world that is peaceful, kind and safe for everyone."

Major Dornan spoke to Junior and Intermediate students, focusing on what military service has meant to him. From a generational family of military members, Major Dornan explained their legacy of service and exemplified the many ways that military members have preserved peace for all Canadians. Major Dornan reminded us how important it is to care for others and be responsible to each other as community members.

Hello VM Community,

It has been such a pleasure welcoming students, educators and families back to school for another exciting year! 2025-2026 may be starting with some logistical challenges, but it has also kicked off with great energy and enthusiasm.

#### **Blending Across non-Immersion and Immersion Classes**

The community feeling will continue to grow through the developing relationships in our partner classes. As we discussed in the Spring - in the e-News, at our June Open House, and when we visited with incoming Grade 6 students and families - a number of our classes are involved in our blending pilot project. Through this initiative, we are engaged in the essential work of removing barriers and setting high expectations for all students. Pairs of classes in each grade have begun working as partners, with non-Immersion and Immersion students and teachers blending their classroom experiences for Language Arts and Math. Next week, we will provide more details to families of students who are involved in the blending initiative. As one of several pilot schools in the OCDSB working with the blending model this year, we are excited to share this experience and our learning with the VM community, and with the District as a whole.

#### **Traffic Management**

Thank you for all of your support with our new arrival and dismissal procedures. We know this is challenging for many families, and we appreciate you: walking students rather than driving;

slowing down while driving near the school; and refraining from driving on Edgecombe St. between 8:00 - 9:00am and 2:30 - 3:30pm.

## Some important reminders:

- From 8:00 9:00am and 2:30 3:30pm, Edgecombe is now a bus loading zone. Bylaw enforcement vehicles have been circulating in the neighbourhood, and a ticket for parking in a bus loading zone is \$105
- The city has recommended that drivers use Botsford rather than Edgecombe see map below.

The reason for this: Students are entering and exiting 7 buses and 7 vans on Edgecombe AND scores of students are also crossing Edgecombe to and from home <u>at the same time</u>. Staff cannot also manage car traffic as well.



Blue lines: recommended routes for walkers Red lines: recommended routes for cars

#### **End of Day Access to the School Yard**

#### **Click for translation**

Hello VM Community,

It's Friday, and the first day of school is right around the corner!

It was wonderful to see families yesterday for a quick visit, in the rain. Folks asked great questions about arrival and dismissal. We have also been consulting with the City of Ottawa, the Ottawa Safety Council, and the OCDSB to plan for safety with respect to our construction zone. Please read below for details and updates.

- Kinder families have already been contacted about your child's class placement
- Grades 1 8: you will receive an email over the weekend with your child's/children's class placement
- Once school begins, educators will be supervising the play yard beginning at 8:15am
- Contact OSTA if you have questions about transportation: OSTA Busing Information

- Here are several important forms to complete:

- No cell phones, personal chromebooks or tablets to be used at school

#### Front of the School

The Smyth sidewalk in front of the school is inaccessible. This will be the case for the duration of the bus loop project. For students and families who walk from the east side of the school, we would recommend:

 At the corner of Edgecombe and Smyth - cross to the south side of Smyth, walk down to the light at Dauphin, and cross back to the school side. From Dauphin, walk along Smyth to school property

### Planned Additional Crossing Guards (not in place next week)

2 additional temporary crossing guards have been approved for the duration of the bus loop project. One will be stationed at the corner of Dauphin and Smyth, and the 2nd at the corner of Edgecombe and Smyth.

Important note: the Ottawa Safety Council is working to staff these positions. These corners will **NOT have crossing guards** yet, i.e. there will not be additional crossing guards to start next week. We will update you as soon as this changes.

Moyra, our wonderful crossing guard at Haig and Smyth, will be returning to that corner.

#### **Buses and Vans**


Buses and vans will be unloading and loading on Edgecombe, to the West of the school. As this is a bus loading zone, it will be **impossible to turn onto Edgecombe from Smyth** once the buses arrive and until they depart. The city is currently working on signage to mark this area as a bus loading zone. Parking in a bus loading zone could result in a hefty fine.

### Consider walking, rather than driving

In addition to the sidewalks, Smyth Road itself is also currently torn up, with lane reductions. All things considered, this may be the time to try walking rather than driving, for the sake of convenience as well as safety.

If you must drive, the City is recommending that you use Botsford Street, since Edgecombe is unavailable. Turn north onto Botsford, and then left onto Hastings. There is an opportunity for cars to turn around at the end of Hastings and face towards the school. Students can be **dropped** on Hastings, before Botsford, so that they can walk along to Edgecombe and you can turn the car back south onto Botsford. (Parking will not be possible on Hastings.)

There will be a staff member to manage the safety of students walking on the west corner of Hastings and Edgecombe from 8:15 - 8:30am and 3:00 - 3:15pm.

## **Entering and exiting the School Yard**

All access to the school will happen through a door in the gate along the intermediate yard (west side of school). Please see my 2 previous emails for further details and see image below.

If students and families have to access the school once the school day begins, this will ONLY happen **through door F.** 

There will be a staff member at door F to greet you. We thank you in advance for your patience; there will be adjustments for us to make given that we can't welcome you through the front door. Safe arrival to the school is one of the most important functions of a school office. Since we are building a new process without the front door access, we have to take it slow and steady to ensure we get it right.
