 - A link to nominate PAC exec members will be sent before the next meeting



• Slow Startup to the Year

- The VSB school of trustees voted to start the year with a 1 day training session on the first day of school regarding anti-racism
 - They watched 5.5 hours of video plus discussion on anti-racism, cultural humility
- There was a delay in going into new classes typically it's done within the first week, but the VSB has undergone an unusual summer period
 - There was a lot of transience within the VSB
 - Many people left the city and many people moved around within the VSB
 - There wasn't too many changes at MTP, but as it's the overflow for other schools
 - The school board told MTP that they could not place students until the first Monday of the school year

• The school is getting an exterior paint refresh

• Parent Conferences

- There will be no in-person parent conferences (a district-wide rule) they will all be virtual
- For Meet the Teacher there will likely be a virtual meet the teacher night, which may include a video walkthrough
- Will discuss the possibility of an informal after school pick up

Ventilation

- The school district, in cooperation with Worksafe BC, have worked on modifying the ventilation in MTP.
- They've changed the fans and filters on the roof of the school, and have changed the air flow within each classroom
- o 90% of the air each hour is new/refreshed from the outside
