Quotes from Sunflower Varsity head coach Lana Williams, three previous team state championships, 14th year coaching

- "I can't believe we lost it this time around. The girls had a solid performance but I knew the judging was going to be harsher since we've been here before."
- "I didn't notice at the start of her routine on bars, but everyone was upset at Michelle for not having her
 hair pulled back entirely, causing a cut in the point system. It bothered us a lot until we realized
 Abigail's bangs didn't hold in her floor tumbling. That's when we knew we were pushing the score."
- "There are rumors that Michenstar paid off West Valley so that they would score higher overall. I trust
 Zang and Carter to be aware of stuff like that, but it's hard to tell whether they got involved to cheat."
- "The girls had a gorgeous routine they had spent months perfecting. I'm ashamed to find out that the smallest difference in scoring can make the difference between state and a second place. All you have to do is do the math! There are certainly a lot of tears going around. As a coach, I am not allowed to question the judges' comments or we could lose our second place finish too. But let's just say that the state association will be hearing from us. We are appealing. Yes indeed we are."

- "It's just not fair! The judges are worthless and I worked my butt off to crush my routine!"
- "I don't get how Michenstar could have won state overall when we out-performed them. All because of
 my frikin' hair! [crying] I bet you a million dollars that is not the reason we lost. There was a scandal
 going on with Michenstar and West Valley. I'm going to dig to the bottom of this."

"I was almost in tears after my routine. Ok, I was in tears. It was just so hard to shake the pressure of trying to win state with my girls. But coach calmed me down until I realized my deductions on routine came from the most petty things. But then I got upset again because it was so petty. It was a rollercoaster. I'd give anything to go back and compete again. I feel like I've let my team down. This is not how I imagined my senior gymnastics career ending."

from judges score cards

- The score cards revealed that two deductions were taken for "hair". For "hair", Garcia was deducted 0.625 points during her floor tumbling routine. For "hair", Tealias was deducted 0.975 points during her bars routine. Both of these deductions caused the two to place second in their respective categories.
- According to state gymnastics rules, gymnasts can lose up to 0.300 points from out-of-place hair or leotards.
