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Reporting Procedures	- Orally notify the Safe School Climate Specialist after being witness to acts of bullying or receiving reports of bullying - File a written report with the Safe School Climate Specialist after being witness to acts of bullying or receiving reports of bullying - Any student who believes s/he has been the victim of bullying/cyberbullying or who has witnessed bullying behavior should report the matter to any school employee, either in writing or anonymously - Parent(s)/guardian(s)/caregiver(s) may file written reports of Suspected bullying/cyberbullying. - Report acts of bullying that may constitute a criminal offense to appropriate law enforcement - Establish a procedure for each school to document and maintain records relating to reports and investigations of bullying in such school and to maintain a list of the number of verified acts of bullying in such school and make such list available for public inspection, and annually report such number to the Department of Education and in such manner as prescribed by the Commissioner of Education	All school employees All school employees All Students All Parents/Guardians/Caregivers School administrator School Principal and School Climate Specialist	Not later than one school day witnessing/receiving report Not later than two school days of oral notification Ongoing Ongoing

Response to Verified Acts of Bullying	- Take prompt corrective action that is reasonably calculated to stop the bullying and prevent any recurrence of such behavior, if it is determined that bullying has occurred - Notify in writing, using the <i>Letter to Parents</i>, not later than forty-eight hours after the completion of the investigation, and invite to a meeting, the parents or guardians of student(s) who committed verified acts of bullying to discuss interventions to prevent further acts of bullying. Also, notify parents or guardians verbally or by electronic mail, if such parents' or guardians' electronic mail addresses are known, that such parents or guardians may refer to the plain language explanation of the rights and remedies available under Conn. Gen. Stat. Sections 10-4a and 10-4b once such explanation has been provided to the Board by the Connecticut Social and Emotional Learning and School Climate Advisory Collaborative and published on the Internet website of Colchester Public Schools. - Notify in writing, using the <i>Letter to Parents</i>, not later than forty-eight hours after the completion of the investigation, and invite to a meeting, the parents or guardians of a student against whom such an act was directed to communicate the measures being taken by the school to ensure the safety of the student against whom such act was directed and policies and procedures in place to prevent further acts of bullying. Also, notify parents or guardians verbally or by electronic mail, if such parents' or guardians' electronic mail addresses are known, that such parents or guardians may refer to the plain language explanation of the rights and remedies available under Conn. Gen. Stat.
