The program is selective, very important to submit a strong application. To be considered for financial aid, you must submit your application and financial aid application by March 3rd. The academy is split into two sessions, students can only take 1 course per session: Session I: July 7 – July 18 (Data Analytics, Cryptography & Security, Software Engineering) Session II: July 21 – August 1 (Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning, Software Application Design) Each session runs Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. The program offers need-based scholarships. Transportation is provided from Anaheim and Santa Ana to UCI.

March 30	Hispanic National Bar Foundation's 2024 Future Latino Leaders Summer Law Institute Designed for high school students interested in law.
