

Dad's Club Board of Directors Meeting Minutes Monday, 15 May 2023, at 6:30 p.m. Dad's Club Aquatic Center: Studio A

I. Declaration of Quorum / Call to Order at 6:35 p.m. – Justin Chapman

- II. Review and approval of minutes of April meeting (Chris DelGardo)
 - a. Remove Jamey from the list of 'present' people in the minutes
 - b. Motion to approve with the change (a) included:
 - i. Motion: Dustin
 - ii. Second: Donald
 - iii. Passed unanimously
- III. Treasurer Report/Financials (Earl Lee / Linda Kutak)
 - a. Income statement YTD this is a record year so far
 - i. Net Profit: \$18,470
 - ii. Net Loss (April): \$26,771
 - iii. This is due to a timing situation
 - 1. Aquatic program receipts came in, but will be reflected in May's numbers
 - 2. In the month of April, there were \$7 K in league fees (as part of the loss shown), this is reimbursed over a few months by the parents
 - 3. Year over year comparison: Facility rental YTD is \$250. Normalized, this should be about \$10K in revenue receipts. Invoices have been sent to Awty, and we expect to receive that soon.
 - 4. Cash projection does not include payroll market adjustments, but we're going to adjust it to reflect the incremental market rate in salaries, etc.
- IV. Report of the Executive Director (Linda Kutak)
 - a. Facility Improvement Updates
 - i. All the improvements are well received people have responded positively about the changes
 - b. Facility Well Update covered in LRPC notes below
 - c. Off-site Growth Opportunity
 - i. Still in discussions with Fonn Villas regarding leasing their water
 - ii. This is important to pursue because we're losing revenue by putting kids on the wait list
 - iii. We propose that we pay a lane-hour fee as much as \$50 per hour
 - iv. Discussions are taking place about us installing a heater (~\$24 K) but they would install and maintain it
 - v. We would break even at ~34 per kid but we would still keep them engaged. Above that number would be profitable (this does not include initial cost for heater) (this does include additional costs of staffing)
 - vi. We are only pursuing this as a seasonal (winter) opportunity. Once March arrives, we don't need the additional water.

- vii. This is Memorial @ Gessner about 20 minutes away from Dad's main campus. This might help draw kids from the southern area.
- viii. Another concern is in pulling kids from main campus to Fonn Villas

d. Local Competition

- i. Timeline has changed (extended their time) from "coming in summer" to "coming soon".
- ii. Looking into changing the format of swim lessons to match the swim team (provide notice to leave)

e. MayFest Updates

- i. We had nearly 1000 people here plenty of new email addresses for the alumni database
- ii. It was hot some of the alumni moved into Studio A to cool off
- iii. Could do better next time:
 - 1. Manage volunteers more specific assignments for jobs
 - 2. TYR had a long line they only brought one person
 - 3. Need better signage of sign-in
 - 4. Perhaps a volunteer tent to help coordinate volunteers

iv. What went well:

- 1. Food worked out well
- 2. Games went very well
- 3. Rock gym were spectacular
- 4. T-shirts were popular, more will be ordered in (the website currently shows 24 April as the end date Rey will get this fixed right away)
- 5. Fire and police were well received
- 6. Church parking was full much of the time
- v. This was our third MayFest: 2018, 2019, then this one
 - 1. Alumni will be invited every five years
- vi. Expense for this event were primarily long-term (e.g. banners, signage), with relatively zero cost for the event otherwise

f. HR Update

- i. Hiring instructors and lifeguards
- ii. Another lifeguard class starting in a few weeks

V. Report of the Head Coach (Rey Aguilar)

- a. Big focus right now is our off-site growth opportunity
- b. Numbers for the swim team: 471 this year vs 475 last year
- c. Shifting to long course as school lets out
- d. Banquet is on 6 June 15 and over groups + graduating seniors recognition dinner
- e. We are getting many compliments on the facilities upgrades

- a. Long Range Planning Committee (Dustin--Chairman) Meeting May15
 - i. Progressive 7/30 fix gutter
 - ii. Concrete fix sidewalk by gym, fix sidewal at entry
 - iii. Well -We are going to get bids ASAP (cost to drill, cost to secure well, etc)
 - iv. Storage we have 1000 square feet at the end of the driveway
 - v. Basement Demolition Call Cherry Demolition
 - vi. Pickleball club continue to pursue this idea
 - vii. Covered water new topic to be included in the LRPC
- a. Fundraising Committee (Sarah—Chairman) Annual Fund Update
 - i. Annual Fund: 6000 letters / 6000 emails
 - 1. Asked for \$75 for 75 years
 - 2. Goal is \$75000
 - 3. Average donation is about double
 - 4. We have a total of \$16 K right now
 - 5. Opportunities
 - a. Some parents have not received emails perhaps we should try the non-MailChimp option to try to bypass spam filters
 - b. Company match is another opportunity to request
 - ii. MayFest
 - 1. We switched out old sponsorship banners for new ones
 - 2. We raised about \$1000 during MayFest
 - iii. Swim Marathon
 - 1. Need a chairman to lead this event
 - iv. Sponsorship
 - 1. Ramping up more sponsorship drives this summer
 - v. Merchandise sales
 - 1. Tshirts are available online.
 - 2. Yard signs, decals, etc. are not available online only at the Dolphin Shop
 - 3. We'll ask Bonnie to look into getting hats at the Dolphin Shop
 - 4. We need to better advertise the Dolphin Shop perhaps a website banner
 - 5. We did just add a new banner on the Dolphin Shop
- b. Swim Team Committee (Kendra / Victoria—Co-Chairmen)
 - i. Swim team and fundraising committees were key contributors to MayFest (food, games, etc.)
