Keywords:

Keywords contain basic ideas or basic concepts that represent the research field and consist of min 5 words

INTRODUCTION (Times New Roman 12 pt, spacing 1.15)

The Introduction section should present the research background, clearly state the research problem, review relevant literature, describe the proposed approach or solution, identify research gaps, and include research hypotheses where applicable.

Manuscripts should be prepared using Times New Roman, 12-point font, with 1.15 line spacing, and justified alignment (left and right). The document must be formatted on one-sided A4 paper (210 mm × 297 mm) with the following margins: top 2.54 cm, and bottom, left, and right 2 cm.

The maximum length of the manuscript is 9,000 words for an original research article and 11,000 words for a review or survey paper. The manuscript is written consisted of introduction, the comprehensive theoretical basis (*optional*), method, results and discussion, conclusion.

METHODS (Times New Roman 12 pt, spacing 1.15)

In this section used to state research design (i.e., qualitative, or quantitative). The subsection should be detailed enough to explain about how they execute their research and conduct the data (i.e., research ethics, sampling, and consents). In the data collection method, the researcher describes in detail the approach in collecting data (eg, interviews, observations, and so on) by describing the types of techniques used (eg, structured interviews, participant observation, and so on). Authors should explain about measurement/s that are used in research which also include the



validity and reliability of the instruments and for the data analysis method, the researcher includes an approach in analyzing the data obtained.

For qualitative research that uses a literature review and systematic review approach, researchers need to mention systematic procedures for data retrieval, such as mentioning the online database used to obtain data (eg, ProQuest, Sage Journal, Elsevier, etc.) and the keywords used to search literature. In addition, researchers also need to mention the process of data extraction, either in the form of a description or in the form of a flow chart.

The results and discussion are adjusted to the research approach. This section should include the discussion of the main results, with supporting references and discuss also the practical implications of your study (including policy, theory, or practice), the limitations, and what further research should do to overcome the limitations

Each table or figure is given a serial number, title, according to the contents of the table and figure, and the source of the citation.


