Camp NAWIC- National Association for Women in Construction

August 1st-5th, you will learn hands-on construction skills, working with real tools. Think you can't do that? YOU CAN. You will learn from women who do this every day and who can share their experiences with you. Construction is NOT just for guys. Have fun with other girls your age while learning some cool tricks at a free summer camp!

Camp NAWIC is a free, week-long day camp for 7th to 12th grade girls to introduce them to a potential career in the construction industry. Many young girls are unaware of the possibility of a rewarding and financially beneficial career in the construction trades or related fields. Camp NAWIC is designed to give them real hands-on experience.

The Howard County GT Summer Institutes for Talent Development is looking for student volunteers to assist in 1st through 8th grade classrooms this summer. The program consists of 2-two week sessions from June 27th through July 22nd and runs in the morning to early afternoon (no class on July 4 or July 19). Every summer, they run Legacy Summer Camp (see attached), which is focused on getting kids (aged 7-17) involved with horses, educating them about rescue work, and encouraging them to spend time outside. Math Placement Academy will be offered to students who place into MATH-061 or MATH-067. Students will have the opportunity to improve their math placement in a structured environment.

Join high school students from across Maryland at this week-long camp in the scenic mountains of Garrett County, Maryland at Hickory Environmental Education Center to explore careers and college studies in natural resources. This partnership with Allegany College of Maryland and the Maryland Department of Natural Resources-Forest Service offers high school students a co-educational opportunity to learn from industry professionals and develop contacts that could lead to future employment and a career in natural resources. The Summer Science Academy at McDaniel College (SSA) offers a variety of science courses in each session and is a fantastic experience for high school students interested in science. Each SSA course is a great opportunity for high school students who are truly interested in science. The week-long experience includes:

- Eligibility for the \$40,000 scholarship! (See more details about the [scholarship](#).)
- Earning one college-level credit-hour, which can be used if the student enrolls at McDaniel as an undergraduate or to whatever college a student decides to attend
- Instruction by a McDaniel professor
- Gaining a strong and realistic perspective about what a college-level science experience is like and what college life is really about

[UMBC Pre-College Program](#)

Academically strong high school students (rising juniors or seniors) can take summer session classes if they meet UMBC's high school [concurrent enrollment](#) requirements. Most credits earned can be applied to degree programs at UMBC or are transferable to other colleges/universities.

[JHU Summer Programs:](#)

Explore Engineering Innovation (EEI), formerly called Engineering Innovation, is an exciting, college-level, summer program for motivated high school students with an aptitude in math and science and an interest in (or curiosity about) engineering. Students complete hands-on projects in a variety of engineering disciplines (civil, electrical/computer, chemical, materials, and mechanical) and learn to think and problem-solve like engineers. Participating students have the opportunity to earn Johns Hopkins University (JHU) credit.

Biomedical Engineering Innovation (BMEI) is a fully online course offered year-round that introduces biomedical engineering concepts to high school students. Participants in this course model biological systems and design experiments to test their models and use engineering principles to solve design problems that are biological, physiological, and/or medical. Students will model human efficiency, the arm, and the cardiovascular system.

They use the content they learned in high school math, physics, and biology to solve practical problems encountered in biomedical engineering.

[Ball State University Interior Design Summer Workshop](#)

If you are a high school student or know one who has an interest in pursuing interior design at the college level, make plans to attend one of the workshops in 2022! The Youth Interior Design Forum (YIDF) is a workshop open to high school students of any grade level and gives them the opportunity to experience interior design firsthand. The workshop blends tradition and innovation in creative learning, covering areas in applied critical thinking and exploration with materials. During the workshop, students explore the fundamentals of 2D and 3D concepts, learn basic drawing and illustration skills, play with color use and light effects, and learn how interior environments affect human behavior. Upon completion, students will have a portfolio of work (a required component for the application for many accredited college interior design programs), an official certificate of completion, and a waiver for an interior design 3-credit hour elective course if the student decides to apply and major in Interior Design at Ball State University.

Camp Kessem

Kesem is a **free resource supporting children impacted by a parent or caregiver's cancer**. We offer year-long services such as a [week-long summer camp](#), biannual reunions, monthly programming, and other individualized support to 6-18 year olds. This year our camp will take place at Camp Airy in Thurmont, MD from August 21-26, 2022. We are in our 5th year here at the University of Maryland chapter, and this past year we supported over 55 children from the D.C., Maryland, and Virginia area. Our programs build communities of support, fun, love, and respect, bonding children together through shared experiences.
