

Gabby Scoring Rubric for Live Coaching Sessions.

Neuro-Language Training for Natural English Speaking

Coaches are responsible for manually scoring student accuracy during Gabby Live Coaching sprints. This rubric details how an accuracy score is chosen, based on the student's mistakes. Examples are given.

These Guidelines are to help both Coaches and Students.

How Did They Do?	Number and Type of Mistakes	Examples
5: Perfect	No mistakes with either the Yes or No answers. Answers are complete sentences.	Yes, I'm hungry. No, they're not late.
4: Almost Perfect	Total of one mistake only. Article omitted or added, word seriously mispronounced, or wrong verb tense.	Yes, I went to home. No, I don't use Yafoo!.
3: Pretty Good	Total of two to three mistakes. Article omitted or added, and/or words mispronounced, and/or wrong verb tense, and/or wrong word spoken.	Yes, there any chopstick. No, I never goed Disneyland ever.
2: Fair	Four or more mistakes of any type, but the student does complete the answer, or mumbles.	Yes, I readed his rsmemlt yesterday. No, she haven't had her stlthsshb at office.
1: Cannot Answer (or "Pass")	Student cannot complete the answer, or indicates a Pass.	Yes, they knowed.....oh, pass. No. Pass.

Please Take Note

- There may be some variation to the No answer. As long as it's grammatically correct, and includes all the key content words of the question, it's OK. For example:
 - Both OK: *No, they're not late. No, they aren't late.*
- Don't replace a word from the question with another similar word in the answer, even if that word has a similar meaning. This is partly a listening exercise, so please include all the content words from the question in each answer. Example:
 - Not OK: *Did you use your laptop? Yes, I used my computer.*
 - Not OK: *Should we go together? Yes, we will go together.*
- With longer questions, it can be easy to forget every word in the current question, but somehow remember a word from the previous question. Listen closely and don't repeat content words from previous questions. This is a mistake.
