

### **Grading with a Grading Guide**

All assignments are set up to utilize a Marking Guide when you grade student's submissions. The Marking Guide is built into the assignment and includes the point ranges for each criterion upon which the students' assignments will be scored. Entering grades with the Marking Guide allows for data to be pulled at a later time to contribute to program assessment reviews. Please note that when using Marking Guides, you will not be able to directly enter scores on the grade book page itself, which is an unreliable and functionally problematic workflow. However, the scores you enter using the Marking Guide will automatically populate the grade book. Follow these Instructor Helps for Using the Grading Guide.

### **Determining Submission Time-stamps on Discussion Posts**

The visible time-stamp on discussion posts (i.e. "Submitted 4 days ago") is relative to the current time and date and may not actually represent the true time-stamp of the submitted post. To reveal the accurate time-stamp of a post, hover over the relative time-stamp. This is the date and time that should be used to determine the post's timeliness. See image below.
