Create an Account

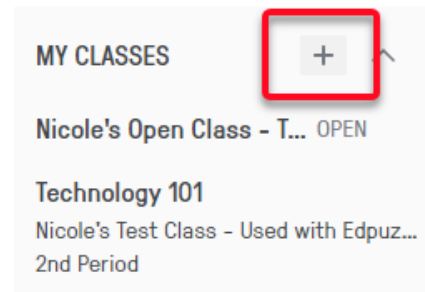
1. Go to www.edpuzzle.com
2. Click Log In

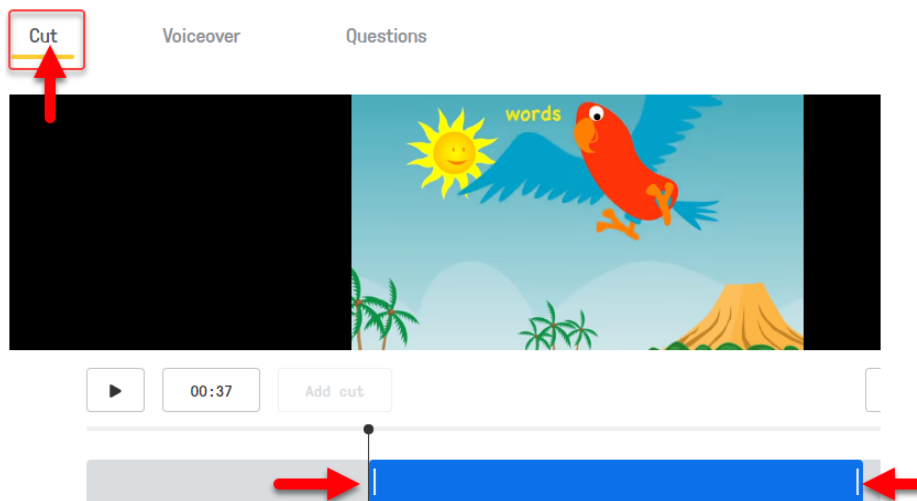

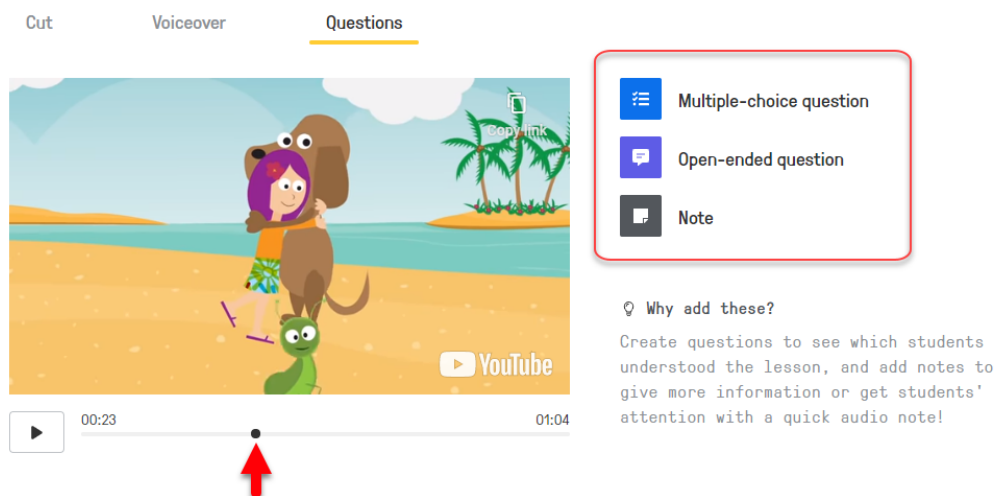
2. Crop the portion of the video you wish to use

1. Click Cut at the top of the screen
2. Drag the white handles in the timeline to crop out the portion of the video you want to use



3. Add questions and audio notes

1. After selecting questions at the top of the screen, drag the slider on the timeline to the spot where you want to insert a question, add a text note or add an audio note
2. Select either question option or click Note
 - a. To add an audio note, select note, then click the microphone under the text box



4. Assign the Edpuzzle video to your students

1. Click Finish when you have edited your video and added the interactive components
2. Click Assign to send the Edpuzzle video to your students
 - a. Select the class
 - b. Set a due date (optional) and turn on or off other video options
 - c. Click Assign
