- 12/12-12/13 Write research paper following template/outline; complete and include work cited page.
- 12/16-12/19: Follow movie directions and make your movie
 - Create Hollywood Pictures folder inside your Hollywood folder. Copy pictures to your Hollywood
 pictures folder. Create a word document and save it to the pictures folder; copy the URL address from
 each picture and paste it into this document.
 - o Narrate movie, add background music, convert work cited page to movie credits.
