Official Board Proceedings

The Town of Cameron held an annual meeting on Tuesday, April 15, 2025, at the Town of Cameron town hall.

Chair Ron Beers called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Chair called for public comment. There was no public comment.

Clerk Danielle Wisz Hall read the April 16, 2024, annual meeting minutes. Shari Immerfall made a motion to approve the minutes as read. John Damrau seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Fire Chief Aaron Andre read the annual fire department report.

Chairman reviewed the annual financial report. Comparison was made between 2023 and 2024 main revenue and expenditure categories. Joan Boehning made a motion to approve the annual financial report. Wayne Thom seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Jim Tremelling made a motion to continue with the 50/50 road aid with Wood County. John Damrau seconded the motion. Motion carried.

John Damrau made a motion to approve permission for short-term borrowing of money if needed for an emergency. Pauline Ertl-Thom seconded the motion. Motion carried.

There is no old business.

New Business:

- a. The town road maintenance road project is on Washington Avenue from Heritage Avenue to 29th Street. It will be ground down and relayed. The funding includes an 80/20 LRIP grant.
- b. Jim Tremelling made a motion to approve raising the Zoning Administrator salary to \$1,200. John Damrau seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- c. There are bags available for anyone who wants to do ditch clean-up.
- d. Tire collection is April 26, 2025, from 8am-12pm at Pankratz Trucking.
- e. Election poll workers are needed. Chief inspector Diane Kessler is no longer available to work at the elections.
- f. Comprehensive plan update: we had a 49.19% response rate. The committee has been working with Wood County to create the report. They are working to create an addendum to the original comprehensive plan. When it is ready, there will be a public hearing. After the public hearing, the plan will be presented to the board. If it is accepted, it becomes part of the ordinances.

Town chair requested residents notify him of any fire signs that are faded. We are also in a reassessment year. The fire department has slow-moving vehicle signs for farming equipment. They are free.

Jim Tremelling made a motion to set the next Annual town meeting on April 21, 2026, at 7:00pm. Joan Boehning seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Shari Immerfall made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Wayne Thom seconded the motion. Motion carried.
